[Colorado State University](http://www.colostate.edu) is offering a **SMALL ANIMAL ACVSMR RESIDENCY POSITION** to qualified DVMs seeking greater exposure to and expertise in the discipline of sports medicine and rehabilitation. The successful candidate must have completed, or be currently receiving training in a rotating small animal internship or equivalent. Preference is given to individuals demonstrating strong interest in clinical research and rehabilitation. Previous experience and/or training in the field of sports medicine and rehabilitation is preferred but not required. Duties of the small animal sports medicine and rehabilitation resident will include supervised clinical assignments, research, and DVM student teaching. Participation in weekly case presentations, journal clubs and daily case rounds will be expected. For successful completion of the residency program, two publications in the area of rehabilitation/sports medicine are required. The resident will be expected to present their research at a major conference (travel funding provided). Residency training will follow the guidelines of the American College of Veterinary Sports Medicine and Rehabilitation and emphasize completion of requirements for successful submission of certifying credentials.

Our team consists of two ACVSMR-diplomates, one physical therapist, one intern, three technicians and 2 residents in training. CSU's program offers access to advanced diagnostic modalities (including ultrasound, CT, PETCT and MRI), a well-equipped rehab facility (including UWTM, laser, ultrasound etc.) as well as access to biological treatments and instrumented gait analysis.

Postdoctoral Fellows (Veterinary Residents) and Veterinary Interns with appointments of half-time or greater are eligible for a suite of benefits including: Medical, Dental, Vision, and Disability Insurance, Life and Voluntary Accidental Death Insurance, participation in Flexible Spending Reimbursement Accounts, Sick Leave accrual and Employee Study Privilege. Enrollment in a retirement plan is required and is effective upon the date of employment, and includes an employer match starting in year 2 of at least half-time employment.

Veterinary licensure: A veterinarian who is employed at a school of veterinary medicine in the state of Colorado and who practices veterinary medicine in the course of his or her employment responsibilities shall either make written application to the State Board of Veterinary Medicine for an academic license or shall otherwise become licensed to practice veterinary medicine within the state of Colorado. The Office of the Dean will pay for the initial application, and individuals will be responsible for renewing their academic licenses every two (even) years.
