Oncology Clinical Trials Patient Care Technician

The Flint Animal Cancer Center at Colorado State University is offering a Research Associate I position. The position is designed for persons with a BS degree with a minimum of two years of experience as a veterinary technician. This position is for candidates interested in gaining experience in management of patient care for a large multi-institutional veterinary clinical trial evaluating a novel cancer preventative vaccine in dogs. This position will be managed by Dr. Doug Thamm, the Principal Investigator. Dr. Thamm is a member of the Flint Animal Cancer Center, within the Department of Clinical Sciences, CVMBS. The 35,000 square foot Flint Animal Cancer Center (FACC) is a research and cancer affinity facility adjoined to the Veterinary Teaching Hospital which houses oncology personnel and operations. Research within the FACC includes: limb sparing, cortical allografts, bone morphogenesis, osteogenesis, stem cell research, infection, tumor markers, drug delivery systems, preclinical drug testing, pharmacology, gene therapy, oncogenesis, metastasis, radiation therapy, pathology and clinical oncology research. Successful candidate must be legally eligible to work in the United States by time of hire; the Clinical Sciences department will not provide visa sponsorship for this position.
